REDD+ in the Green Heart of Africa: A Participatory, Science-based Approach to Conservation

USAID/Central Africa Regional Program for the Environment (CARPE)

Central Africa Regional Program for the Environment (CARPE) activities are laying the groundwork across the Congo Basin for meaningful REDD+ participation from the local to the national level. This event features presentations by CARPE partners and the premier of a short video, "Voices from the Forest", in which villagers from the Republic of Congo discuss the challenges they face posed by climate change and forest degradation.

USAID Assistant Administrator Eric Postel will open the event with a brief overview of USAID policies related to climate.
