A total of 138 patients were treated at the Bomassa Health Centre. Makao's centre has registered 27 patients.

RESEARCH AND MONITORING

Elephant Listening Project (ELP):

Two field teams went for the 7th deployment of the ARUs. Elephant Listening Project's 3 research assistants continue working on their individual scientific projects.

Wildlife Health Program (WHP): A total of 8 parrots are currently under care of the Bomassa Rehabilitation Centre. This month an epidemic broke out killing 4 parrots and 2 news seized parrots arrived at the Centre

NNNP RESEARCH SITES



Mondika: Confirmed presence of a new female and her baby in Mététélé's group. An interaction between Kingo and an unknown silverback was observed. A new female joined Kingo's group the next day.



Mbeli Bai Study: A young silverback named Custer attacked a female that had not been observed for the past 4 years, Ndebele. This demonstration of dominance is a typical behavior of male gorillas towards the new females in their group.



Goualougo Triangle Ape Project (GTAP): Two chimpanzee newcomers, Terry and Rose, have joined the Moto community with infants. Loya's group had a total of 23 intergroup encounters.

TOURISM
