Congo Basin Forest Fund

WHO WE ARE

Dulti-donor Trust Fund which seeks to alleviate poverty and address climate change by financing projects that seek to change the way that people live in and earn a living from the Congo Basin forests and the way that governments protect and preserve these forests

Pilot mechanism: 2008-2018

Established: United Kingdom, Norway, COMIFAC

Canada joined in 2012

□Housed: African Development Bank

□Total Capitalization: ~139 million Euros

Competitive calls for proposals

Up-scaling of high-performing projects with demonstrable impact

40 Operations in 7 years

71.5 million Euros in Committed Funds

51.5 million Euros Disbursed







Selected Results

More than 25,000 hectares of forest species planted by Forest Communities

> Supporting the REDD+ process in Central Africa: 6 Pilot Projects in DRC; R-PP Prepared for 5 Countries

More than 200,000 participants in the production, processing, and/or selling of forest products Over 200,000 direct beneficiaries of CBFF-funded activities







Selected Results (cont.)

Over 200 forestrelated studies Conducted 55 scholarships awarded for the pursuit of Bachelor's, Master's, and Doctorate Degrees in forestry studies Over 30 million hectares of forest mapped out with primary use

CBFF Projects Awarded Equator Prize and Energy Globe Award







Lessons Learned

Lack/limited capacity of grant recipients

Up-front risk assessment at fund, country and project levels

Stronger thematic focus of calls for proposals

Fund/Agency mismatch

Fund ownership

Challenges in securing future funding

High sensitivity to trends in development assistance

Timeframe for return on investments







Conclusion & Way Forward

Trust fund: 'glue' for national, regional and bilateral efforts in sustainable forestry and REDD+

Extensive on-theground experience with broad-range of actors Knowledge of costs associated with working small grants and grantees

Ready to overhaul and revamp based on lessons learned Independent evaluation planned for first semester 2016
