




Poaching (and trafficking) Crisis

Only **25,000 – 35,000** remain



Estimated African Ape Numbers




Gorillas: Maintain at 155,000?


Chimpanzees: Maintain at 200,000?

- Enhancing forest-dependent community livelihoods


