

The University of Dschang (Uds) in few words

- Is the first regional Agricultural and natural resources oriented university created in 1993 from the former Schools of Agronomy starting from 1960's (with ENCA);
- Is composed of 7 Faculties/institutes among which the Faculty of Agronomy and Agricultural Sciences (FAAS/FASA);
- Nearly 35,000 students are enrolled, of which about 10% are enrolled in postgraduate studies;
- Is part of a large and dynamic partnership at national (private & public sector), regional and international level.

- Typology of ecosystems (Instructor: Pr Tsi);
- Biodiversity conservation (Instructor: Pr Tchamba);

- Agrobiodiversity (Instructor: Dr AVANA); and
- Ecotourism (Instructor: Dr Tsague)

RIFFEAC: Capacity Building for Sustainable Management of the Congo Basin Forest ... through

- Regional partipatory curricula development in Forest Management and for vocational training, Bachelor and Master studies;
- Research subsidies to students and lecturers to generate knowledge;
- FASA-Uds positions as regional knowledge centre in Agroforestry training;
- Material support and infrastructure development
- Training of trainers (TOT) to reduce expertise gaps



Strategic Partnership-2



ANAFE: Building institutional capacity to enhance capacity for agricultural development in Africa agricultural Education ...through

- Reviewing and developing new curricula to respond to emerging agricultural job market;
- Training of lecturers in pedagogy and contextualising texbooks developement;
- FASA-Uds as pilot regional institution to develop and test the new curricula in agricultural risk management including Climate Change;

Strategic Partnership-2 (Cont'd)

- 13 fellowships granted for Msc students to generate knowledge on agricultural risk management and agribusiness developement;
- Support for recording and traceability of FASA alumni;
- Support for the Study of the State of knowledge on agricultural risk management



Strategic Partnership-3

Platform in Partnership for Research and Training (PCP) in Agroforestry ... through

- Joint resources mobilisation to improve the performance of Agroforestry systems in Cameroon (SAFSE, AS4FOOD, Trade of Cocoa to name a few); and
- Training of 17 students (Bachelors, Msc) and 7 PhD candidates so as to increase the pool of expertise in agroforestry.
